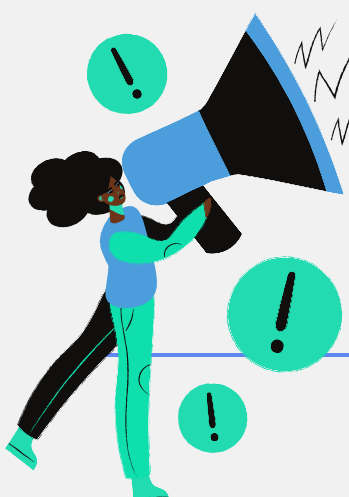

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

Use the present continuous for events/situations that are changing.

FORM:

to be + verb + ing

EXAMPLE:

Investing in ETFs is becoming really popular at the moment.
